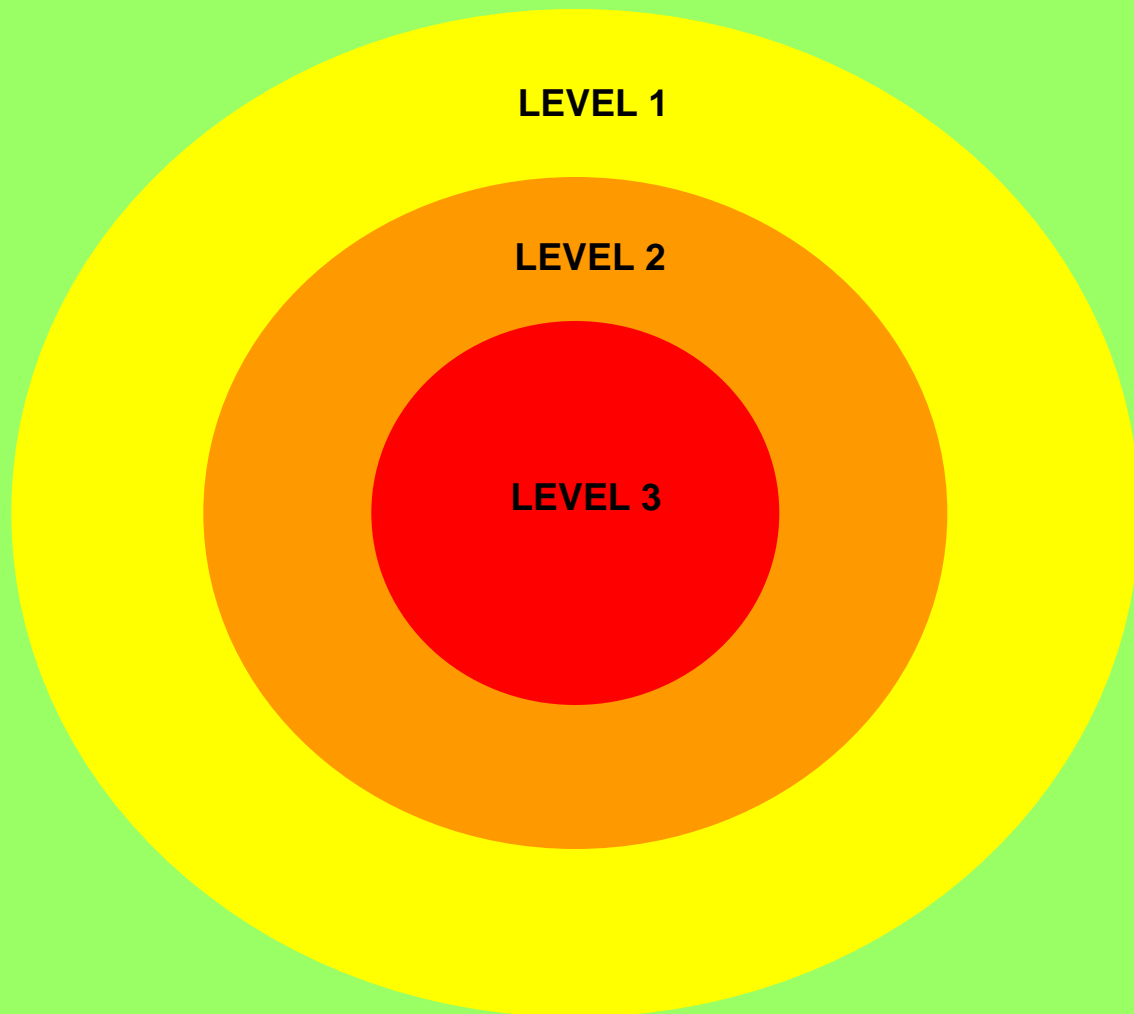

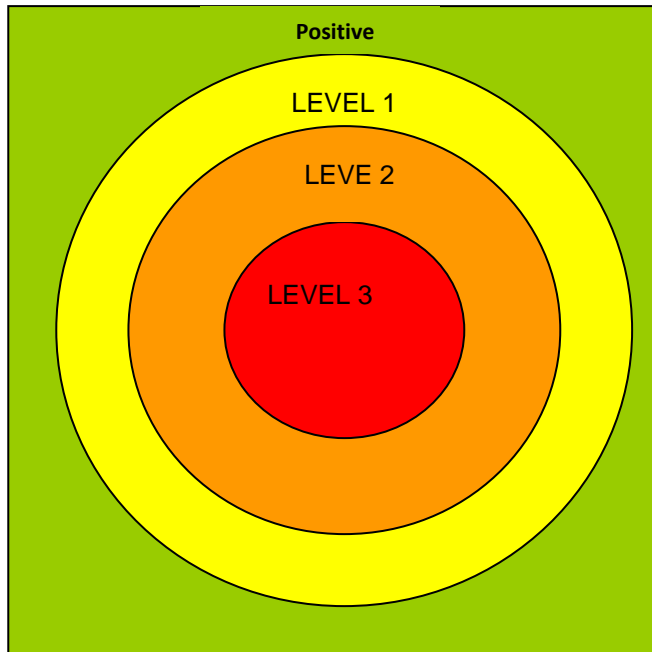
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What is the Levels of Behavior model?

The Levels of Behavior model is a simple classroom behavior management system. Using a levels of Behavior framework a teacher works with their students to construct a visual map of behavior and consequence. It has been used very successfully by many teachers in Western Australian schools over the past few years and this Student Behavior System strategy booklet is now available online Through – studentbehaviorsystems.com

The main Poster has in the past been downloaded from the booklet and made into a large poster often A0 or A1 size. In recent times however as more and more classrooms get 'Smart' electronic boards, the poster and behavior descriptor cards are being PROJECTED in the classroom – The choice is yours.

BEGINS AS A CHART LOOKING LIKE THIS (see poster page)

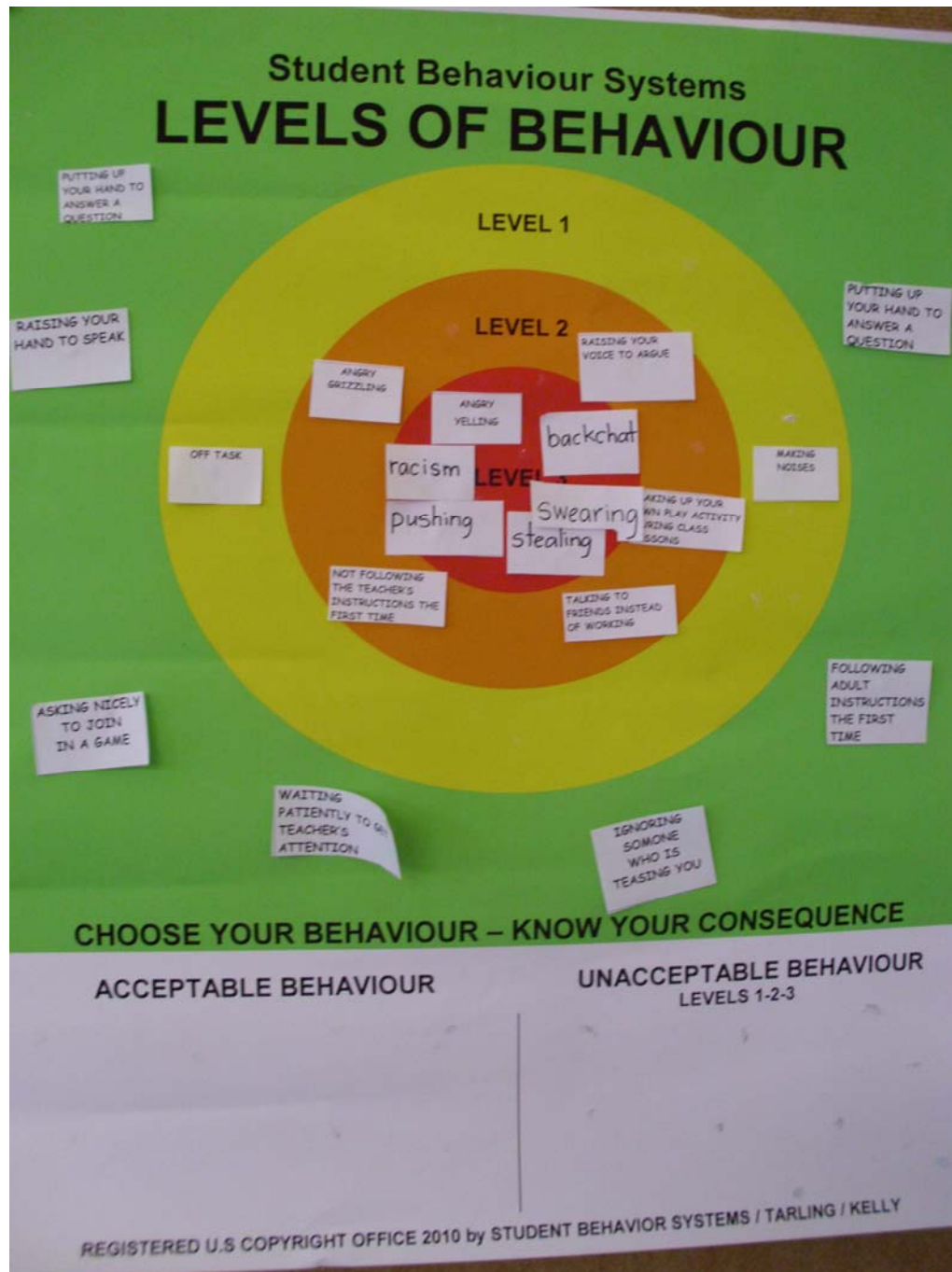


Acceptable Behavior	Unacceptable Behavior

Then teacher and students then jointly review descriptors of specific behaviors and then they place behavior descriptor into either the acceptable or unacceptable category. The next step with teacher guidance leading the student discussion, all acceptable behaviors are placed into the green section of the chart. Attention now turns to the list of unacceptable behaviors and there is a discussion to categorise each behavior descriptor as either minor, moderate or severe.

Examples of Behavior Descriptors

Putting up your hand to answer a question	Calling out	Working independently on class task	Kicking a student
Not following a teacher's instruction the first time	Swearing at another student or teacher	Throwing objects in class	Finishing your work
Trying your hardest	Angry noises	Asking to join a game	Helping someone in need
